Of the many songs to gain popularity in 1917, "Boldly, Comrades in Step" was one of the few specifically connected with the Russian revolutionary movement. Listen for the stylistic similarities and differences between this song and others, such as "The Warsaw Song." Like many of the songs that accompanied the demonstrations and ceremonies of 1917, "Boldly, Comrades in Step" often served as a symbol of common aspirations that transcended party divisions.
